


Christmas Lunch at Sacred Heart

How Can We Build a Dialog Process?

It is important to try and relate to others, but it can be a challenging and a little scary. Politics, sports, and religion are just a few examples of topics we may disagree with others on. In disagreeing times, try and remember Jesus' dialogue with the Sadducees. This will give you a three-part model to help guide difficult conversations. "The Word Among Us" (Daily Meditations) laid out the model by explaining each piece:

- 1. <u>Be Peaceful</u>: Try to approach people who are different from you by keeping peace in your heart. Even if you do not agree with their views, don't forget that God loves them. Let your own demeanor set the tone for your conversation rather than thinking of the other person as an enemy.
- 2. Find Common Ground: A great start to a conversation is beginning with something that you both agree on. This will start meaningful and fruitful conversation even is you disagree with 90% of the person's outlook.
- Make Positive Connections: Find ways in which the other person's outlook aligns with Scripture and Catholic teachings. Help them realize that they are closer to the Lord than they may think and that God is closer to them as well. Come from a place of love and you will make a difference.
