The abstract for the article is as follows:

"Following the destruction of the temple in 70 CE, different religious groups within Judaism, called formative Judaisms, strived to be the legitimate, official group to lead the people of Israel. The Matthean community was one of these formative Judaism groups. The one tool different groups used to legitimize and differentiate themselves was the orthodox interpretation and observance of the Torah. Matthew, too, uses the Torah to present his community as an authentic, law-abiding group and to direct attention to the dominant group's deficiency in their interpretation and observance of the law. Matthew then offers a new hermeneutical principle of interpreting the Torah that is based on love, mercy, and justice, as taught by Jesus."

Congratulations, Fr. Vien, on this contribution to the academic discourse within biblical scholarship!
