Innovative Preparation for Proposed Changes in PPF6: The sixth edition of the *Program of Priestly Formation* (PPF6) includes some **significant changes** we are thoughtfully reflecting on how to best adapt. One example is the **propaedeutic year**. This could be a **significant challenge** for rural dioceses or smaller religious communities where potential seminarians live far away from each other. **We can help fill that need** by offering a blend of events; in-person retreats at Sacred Heart followed by on-going formation virtually. Several faculty members at Sacred Heart are leading a fascinating national study examining effective strategies in preaching Jesus' parables.
