May Session Course Offerings (May 17 - June 18, 2021)

PH--508 Natural Theology (Dr. John Gallam) Virtual via Zoom Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday 9:30-11:15am

(3 credits) Using only the tools of rational reflection, this course explores the nature of God and critically examines arguments for and against God's existence. It includes a study of the systems of justification available to theistic belief, and the challenge to theism posed by the existence of evil.

PH--509 Epistemology (Dr. John Gallam) Virtual via Zoom Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday 1:00-2:45pm

(3 credits) This course examines the definitions, sources, and types of human knowledge and justified belief. It includes treatments of belief justification in science, morality, and religious faith, and the challenges posed by skepticism and relativism.

DT--589 Reading the Letter to the Hebrews with St. Thomas Aquinas (Dr. Michael Brummond) Virtual via Zoom Monday & Thursday 9:00--11:00am

(2 credits) This course examines theological topics such as Christology, priesthood, and the nature of faith through the lens of St. Thomas Aquinas' commentary on the letter to the Hebrews. It places in dialog the work of contemporary exegesis and the historical critical method with the wisdom of Thomas' commentary on Hebrews in an effort to draw forth the best both have to offer in reading the text. Prerequisite: Fundamental Theology, equivalent/consent

SP--510 Foundations of Christian Spirituality (Dr. Marianne Siegmund) Online only with no virtual Zoom sessions

(3 credits) The course introduces the academic study of Christian spiritual expressions and practices over the past two millennia. It highlights the richness of the Roman Catholic spiritual tradition by examining the various schools of spirituality (Benedictine, Franciscan, Dominican, Ignatian), traditional devotions (Marian, Sacred Heart), and current trends.

Summer Session Course Offerings (June 6 - August 13, 2021)

CS--605 Canon Law of Marriage (Fr. John Cella, OFM) Virtual via Zoom Monday & Wednesday 1:00-4:25pm

(3 credits) This course examines the codes in canon law relating to marriage, especially with regard to the pastoral preparation for marriage, impediments to sacramental marriages, canonical requirements for the celebration of the Sacrament of Matrimony, and the annulment process. The course also discusses reception of the sacraments by those in irregular marriages and various current issues.

DT--601 Person and Destiny in a Fractured World (Dr. Jeremy Blackwood) Online with Virtual optional sessions via Zoom Friday 9:00-10:00am

(3 credits) This course is a study of our humanity in the light of God's revelation in Jesus Christ. It therefore covers the doctrines regarding human beings as created in the image of God, grace, justification, free will, gifts of the Spirit, and the relation between the natural and the supernatural. Components may also give specific attention to the last things and/or to pastoral application. [Equivalent to DT--600 Theological Anthropology and Eschatology] Prerequisite: Fundamental Theology, equivalent/consent

PS--551 Relational Leadership: Potential & Practice for Pastoral Settings (Ms. Julie O'Connor) Online with two Zoom Sessions July 6 & 27 1:00-2:00pm

(2 credits) In this course students will define relational leadership, and identify basic model characteristics and qualities. Students will examine various topics including: leadership theory, dimensions of relational leadership, personal leadership strengths, ethical leadership, group dynamics, and organizational culture. Students will recognize and assess their own leadership traits and skills. Emphasis will be placed on the practice of leadership in lived experiences of pastoral settings.
