


Lilly Endowment's Pathways for Tomorrow Initiative

Formation Corner



The final days of the calendar year serve as a retrospective, a look back at accomplishments as we turn the page unto a new year with goals, resolutions, and hopes. The seminarians anticipate serving in parishes for Sunday Masses beginning the weekend of January 22-23, 2022, an essential aspect of Pastoral Formation outside of the seminary faith community. These parish placements have included parishes at which some of them attended weekly Sunday Mass during the Fall Semester after which they wrote brief reflections on the worship experience. The seminarians in Third Theology will be assisting at the parishes which they will serve as transitional deacons (God willing) in the school year 2022-2023. From January 8-12, 2022, the seminarians will be on a spiritual formation retreat at Benet Lake Retreat House led by SHSST alumni Fr. Patric Nickolas. The Pastoral and Spiritual life here resumes for Spring Semester on January 18, 2022 with our usual Tuesday Morning Prayer at 7 AM and Evening Prayer at 5:15 as celebrated in Spanish. Daily Mass on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday is offered beginning at 7:30 AM. Once the Spring Semester begins, seminarians will continue meeting their human formation advisor at least once every three weeks as well as their Spiritual Director at least once a month. Together we form a Formation Community in Christ as formators in all four dimensions, accompanying those entrusted to us by their sponsor diocese and religious congregation through the stages of discipleship, configuration to Christ, and pastoral synthesis.
