



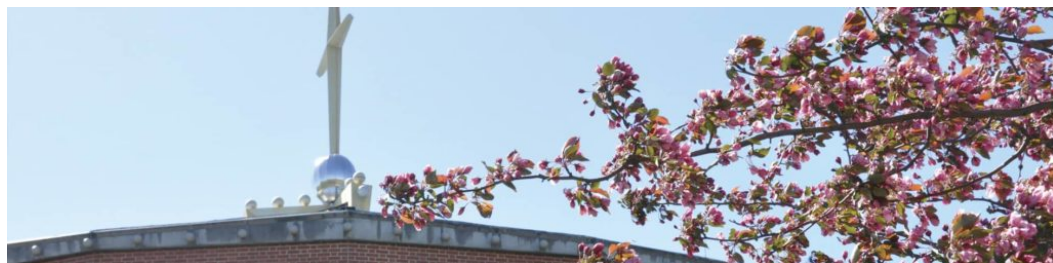

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Prayer Service

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee hosted the 31st annual Martin Luther King Jr. Prayer service, on January 15, titled The American Dream. The keynote speaker was Makda Fessahaye, J.D. Blessings were given by the Most Rev. Jerome E ListECKi, Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Sacred Heart's Director of Liturgy and Music, Dr. Ben Stone, is on the planning committee for the service as Sacred Heart's representative. He played one piece as part of the prelude, "Adoration" by Florence Price (1885–1953). Price was the first black woman composer to have a symphony performed by a major symphony orchestra, and a prominent pianist, organist, and teacher in Chicago in the first half of the 20th century.

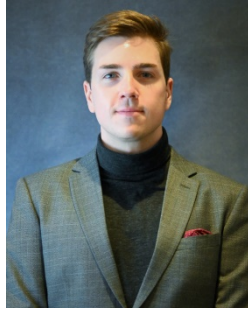


Jewish Studies Seminar for Christians: The Jewish People and the Church Webinar Series
