


Greeting from Rome!


Toolbox for Pastoral Leaders: New and Soon to be Priest Pastors

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee will be hosting a Toolbox for Pastoral Leaders facilitated by the faculty of Leadership Roundtable

(<u>https://leadershiproundtable.org/</u>) at Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology in Hales Comers, Wisconsin, <u>May 15 – 20, 2022</u>. The toolbox is developed to help prepare new and soon to be priest pastors, with a variety of leadership skills. The toolbox will start with dinner at Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, 5 PM on Sunday May 15, 2022 and will be followed by an orientation session of the days and topics to follow. There will be daily Eucharist, as well as Morning and Evening Prayer. It is anticipated that the toolbox will conclude with noon lunch on Friday, May 20. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee, in conjunction with Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology, is offering an all-inclusive rate per participant of \$2,411 including meals and lodging at the Seminary or at the Hampton Inn nearby. Transportation will be provided to shuttle participants who stay at the Hampton Inn to the Seminary.

Sacred Heart Seminary has been awarded a grant and will be offering a \$500 per participant scholarship that will be applied to the participant rate making **the net cost \$1,911 per participant**. Travel costs will be the responsibility of the participant. The toolbox will be limited to 30 participants so please make your reservations soon.

Day of Recollection with Bishop William Wack, Pensacola-Tallahassee Sacred Heart will have a Day of Recollection on March 2 with Bishop William Wack from the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. We invite you to also reflect on the topic of the day.

"Leave all things behind; I am doing something new"

The first reflection will focus on clearing away old ways of thinking and acting. God continually calls us to turn away from sin and focus anew on Him. We all no doubt feels weighed down by past hurts, disappointments, and sins. How do we let go of that? How can we begin to move on?

For the second reflection, the emphasis will be on the beautiful passage from the Book of Revelation: "Behold, I make all things new" (Rev. 21:5). Our God

promises to bring renewal to all of creation – and to each of us individually – again and again. How is this possible? Where do we see evidence of this renewal in our lives?

Lent is the perfect time for us to reflect on these things. At the celebration of the Eucharist today we see this theme of 'turning away from sin/accepting the Good News' come alive. I pray that this day of reflection will be fruitful for your spiritual growth and your discipleship with the Lord.
