



Heart of Christ Award

Sacred Heart welcomed alumnus, Fr. Christopher Klusman, to talk about "The Path of the Deaf Apostolate". Both Fr. Klusman and his intern Todd Honas shared their experiences, including Fr. Klusman's path to priesthood. Fr. Klusman also shared his extensive outreach work on making the church more accessible to the deaf community.



Supporting International Students

Pearce Pomerleau, International Student Services Specialist, offered Sacred Heart staff an overview of the VISA process. Sacred Heart is happy to provide this specialized expertise to sponsors with international students.

Lux Center Spring Lectures

Approximately 80 people attended the Lux Center's Spring Public Lecture. Dr. Malka Z. Simkovich presented on the topic "Jewish Sects in the New Testament". Dr. Simkovich is the Crown-Ryan Chair of Jewish Studies and the Director of the Catholic-Jewish Studies program at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. The next day, Dr. Simkovich spoke to faculty, staff, and seminarians on the topic "What did Judea-Diaspora Relations Look Like in the Hellenistic World?". The Lux Center programming aims to educate us and strengthen the relationship between Catholics and the Jewish People.

Interactive Seder Dinner

Before the Passover holiday, Lux Center Co-Directors Rabbi Michal Woll and Mr. Jon Sweeney hosted a Seder dinner for the seminarians, providing them with the opportunity to learn about this tradition.









Building a Healthy Community

Sacred Heart engaged in several educational events and activities over the spring semester to encourage healthy lifestyles for our seminarians.



Health & Wellness Coaching

Bridgett Wilder from Perseverance Health and Wellness Coaching spoke to our seminarians about healthy eating and strategies for making more nutritious food choices. She also shared a demonstration of how to exercise in small spaces and in short bursts.





Fit February Challenge

Student Services sponsored "Fit February", a walking challenge to get our seminarians up and moving during the winter. The participants logged a total of 2,188,440 steps for the month of February, which was calculated to be a whopping 1,036.2 miles!

Human Sexuality Conference

Fr. Kevin Barnekow provided our seminarians a Conference on Human Sexuality. The seminarians helped to form the discussion by submitting questions and topics in advance of the seminar.

Having Fun for a Good Cause

Seminarians organized a fun fund-raiser, benefitting the Women's Support Center of Milwaukee.
Over \$2500 was raised! Fourteen participants, comprised of seminarians, students, faculty, and staff, ate their way through 10 levels of hot sauce. The final winner was Dr. Michael Brummond, Associate Professor of Systematic Theology.
