


Toolbox for Pastoral Management

Congratulations to Fr. John Paul Mitchell!

Sacred Heart is honored to announce a great accomplishment for Fr. John Paul Mitchell, adjunct lecturer in Scripture Studies at Sacred Heart and formation advisor at St. Francis de Sales Seminary (SFdSS). After the successful October 2022 defense of his dissertation, "Ziba and Mephibosheth: Minor Characters and the Drama of Reading in the Characterization of David's Denouement in 1–2 Samuel," the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome formally granted Fr. Mitchell the degree Sacrae Theologiae Doctor (S.T.D.) on May 31, 2023, summa cum laude. This revered ecclesiastical degree marks the pinnacle of an arduous academic journey and serves as a great gift for Sacred Heart, SFdSS, and the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.


Below is an abstract of Fr. Mitchell's dissertation, directed by R.P. Prof. Jean-Pierre Sonnet, S.J. Please join Sacred Heart in congratulating Fr. John Paul Mitchell!

Title: Ziba and Mephibosheth: Minor Characters and the Drama of Reading in the Characterization of David's Denouement in 1–2 Samuel Abstract: This study provides a narrative analysis of the role of the minor characters Ziba and Mephibosheth in the characterization of David's denouement in 1–2 Samuel, with particular attention to the final adjudication David renders between the two in 2Sam 19,30[29]. Investigating three main scenes (2Sam 9; 16,1 4; 19,25 31[24-30]), along with two supplementary verses arranged prospectively and retrospectively at the beginning and end of 2 Samuel (2Sam 4,4; 21,7), the study closely traces the drama of reading with its interplay of curiosity, suspense, and surprise, at work in 1–2 Samuel. A richly textured portrait of David's rise, struggles, and maturation in his exercise of kingship emerges in which is situated the illuminating role of Ziba and Mephibosheth as foils of David in his display of TON. Though David's adjudication remains mimetically ambiguous to the end so as to immerse the reader in his royal dilemmas, the present study provides exegetical grounding to read his decision as indicative of a king ruling with God's own heart. Such rule entails a king who acts in trustful surrender to the will of God, upholding his justice and displaying his mercy, true to one's word, with the combined qualities of Ziba's acuity and Mephibosheth's innocence of heart.

Publication Plans: Fr. John Paul published an Extract of his dissertation with the Gregorian University in hopes of publishing the complete work in the Library of Hebrew Bible / Old Testament Studies (LHBOTS), or another academic series with broader readership over the course of the next school year.
