

WORLD DAY OF CONSECRATED LIFE

Friday, February 2, is World Day of Consecrated Life; the date was chosen by Pope John Paul II to correspond with the Feast of the Presentation. Many parishes will commemorate the day during the February 3-4 liturgies.

What is "Consecrated Life?" It can take several forms, but one of the most common is that of priests, brothers and sisters who live their vocations as members of a religious order. Through their vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, members of the Priests of the Sacred Heart, or Dehonians, live Consecrated Life following the charism of their founder, Fr. Leo John Dehon.

Let us pray for those who live the call to Consecrated Life, and for those discerning God's call to be a religious:

Lord,
you have provided us
with priests, brothers, and sisters
throughout the history of your Church
