Faithfulness in Love of the Church

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To the Community of Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology Hales Corners, Wisconsin

I was pleased to greet a number of you at the General Audience of 6 March 2024, and I extend my prayerful good wishes to all the seminarians, clergy and lay faithful who form the community of Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology. In particular, to you, dear seminarians, I want to offer some brief considerations on three realities essential to your preparation for priestly ministry in the Church: prayer, fraternity and mission.

Before all else is prayer. Just as Moses spoke with God face to face (cf. £x 33:11), so in individual moments of prayer, as well as in the celebration of the sacraments, we encounter the loving presence of the Lord who gives us the grace to discover his will for our lives and strengthens us to bear hardships, carry out difficult and even unpleasant tasks and serve others with undivided hearts. I encourage you, then, to cultivate a profound relationship of communion with Jesus, one built upon the dialogue of daily prayer, both personal and liturgical, meditation on the word of God and especially time spent listening to him in silent adoration before the tabernacle. For the more we are united in this way to Christ the Good Shepherd, the more we brings.

The second reality I would mention is fraternity. Like the disciples whom Jesus chose to be with him (cf. Mk 3:14), your time

Strengthening Priestly Formation


All Seminarian Conferences

Fostering the Dehonian Mission

Formation with Openness, Adaptability, and Fidelity

Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology is an apostolate of the Priests of the Sacred Heart, also called SCJs after the Latin initials of their name *Sacerdotum Corde Jesu*, or Dehonians, after their founder Venerable Fr. Leo John Dehon.

Fr. Dehon's first assignment was in an urban parish in the town of Saint-Quentin, France, during the Industrial Revolution. Daily life for factory workers was very difficult, and he saw that the Church needed a more robust pastoral ministry. He started by going out to the people to see what they needed. He established schools, youth centers, and newspapers, and sent priests into the neighborhoods and factories where the people were. Soon, he realized he needed more religious committed to this type of ministry and he was allowed to begin a religious order.

Fr. Dehon also realized that the priests needed formation to prepare them for their ministries in a changing world. SCJ author Andre Perroux wrote: "Clearly, one of the spiritual aims of his Congregation was to develop a serious program of studies in order to improve the quality of priestly ministry", Fr. Dehon was seeking formation that would allow for "...informed dialog with the world, shaking the Church out of its habitual passivity...remarkable openness and adaptability...undeniable fidelity" (*Leo Dehon: A Passion for Christ, A Passion for the World*, by Andre Perroux SCJ, page 21.)

A Seminary for the Future

Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology (SHSST) embodies these characteristics to this day. Sacred Heart has a long history of adapting to meet the changing needs of our Church. Beginning as a novitiate for SCJs in 1928, the institution became a theologate, then open to other religious orders, then later vocations, then dioceses.

SHSST reflects the openness, adaptability, and fidelity that Fr. Dehon called for so many years ago, and that the Church still needs today: implementation of the *Program of Priestly Formation 6th Edition*, establishing a Propaedeutic Stage program, offering Master of Arts programs in Catholic Studies as well as Theology, Master of Divinity degree, Individualized Ordination Track, Hispanic Preparation for Ministry, English and Culture Studies, and soon a pontifical degree!

Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology is again on the brink of an exciting year of growth, and we are thankful to the Priests of the Sacred Heart for their financial, spiritual, and pastoral support.

Together, may we conform our world to the Heart of Christ!

A Smooth Transition in Leadership



Meet our Interim President-rector: Fr. Tom Cassidy, SCJ! Fr. Tom begins July 8th, 2024, but is not new to SHSST. Fr. Cassidy is an experienced leader with a long and successful ministry in Catholic education, including serving as Sacred Heart's President-Rector from 2004-2007. Fr. Cassidy served as General Councilor for the Priests of the Sacred Heart in Rome and as Provincial Superior of the US Province. He was President of the Conference of Major Superiors of Men (CMSM) in the United States. A Milwaukee native, Fr. Cassidy has ministered in many parts of the world as a Priest of the Sacred Heart. His leadership skills and experience will be a blessing to the seminarians, students, faculty and staff of SHSST.



Fr. Stephen Huffstetter, SCJ, has been named as the President-Rector Designate. He is currently completing his second term on the Dehonians' General Council in Rome. When he returns to the United States, he will live on campus, which will allow him to familiarize himself with SHSST while on sabbatical. He will assume his new position at the start of the 2025 academic year. Before his election to congregational-level leadership, he was the Provincial Superior of the US Province. Fr. Huffstetter brings with him the robust pastoral experience of serving among the Native Americans in rural areas of South Dakota, and a vision of the global Church which has been enriched by his 10 years in Rome.

We believe Fr. Cassidy and Fr. Huffstetter will be a great team to shepherd formation at SHSST.
