Exploring the Canon: Theological and Hermeneutical Dimensions of Scripture On April 7, Fr. Artur Sanecki, SCJ, delivered his paper entitled "Back and forth: Biblical Canon – a theological problem or hermeneutical possibility?" In his presentation, he explored the enduring relevance of the biblical canon, emphasizing its central role in the Church's history and theological reflection. Drawing from his abstract, Fr. Sanecki offered a concise introduction to ongoing

scholarly debates surrounding the canon, examining it not only as a theological construct but also as a hermeneutical key for biblical exegesis. His approach highlighted the multifaceted nature of the canon—viewed through historical, sociological, literary, and theological lenses—and its significance in contemporary theological discourse.
