

Holy Mass for the Opening of the Academic Year

The new semester began with the annual Holy Mass for the Opening of the Academic Year on August 27, followed by a warm welcome dinner. During the liturgy, the Very Rev. 


Catholic Biblical Association's 87th International Meeting

Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology is proud to share that Liran Gerassi, Director of The Lux Center for Catholic-Jewish Studies, recently participated in a panel titled "*Jewish-Christian-Muslim Dialogue and the Role of Scripture*" at the Catholic Biblical Association's 87th International Meeting, held at Loyola University Chicago.

In his remarks, Liran offered a unique perspective on the Jewish approach to interfaith dialogue. He noted that the Hebrew Bible, composed long before the emergence of Christianity or Islam, does not directly address other faiths. As a result, Jewish scripture itself plays little direct role in shaping Jewish engagement in interfaith conversations today. Instead, he observed, modern Jewish participation in interfaith dialogue developed largely among diaspora communities after the Holocaust, motivated by a desire to better understand other faith traditions and reduce tensions between communities.

Alongside Liran, the Catholic community was represented by Ms. Susan McNeil, Director of the Department for Catholic Social Responsibility at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, who also serves as a teacher at our seminary and as a board member for The Lux Center.
