



Professor of Theology, Open Rank

SACRED HEART SEMINARY AND SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY seeks candidates for an open-ranked, full-time academic faculty appointment in systematic or dogmatic theology, eligible for tenure. The position starts August 1, 2027. Specialization is open but assumes a broad competency to teach multiple subdisciplines, including fundamental theology, Christology, anthropology, ecclesiology, ecumenism, and world religions. The successful candidate should possess a doctorate, although qualified ABD candidates will be considered. Candidates must demonstrate a firm commitment to the institution's Roman Catholic mission, priestly and lay formation, and the seminary's community life. Candidates possessing a canonical degree (STD, STL), or those willing to pursue such a degree, are strongly encouraged to apply. Finalists must satisfy all canonical requirements for seminary formation. Salary and rank will be commensurate with academic credentials, publication record, and teaching experience. The normal graduate teaching load is 3-3.

Review of applications will begin Oct. 19 and continue until the position is filled. To apply, please prepare:

- a cover letter;
- a *curriculum vitae*; and
- three letters of recommendation.

Candidates who are extended first-round interviews must further submit a one-page teaching philosophy aligned with the institution's mission and values.
